**ORDER GRANTING PLAINTIFF'S *EX PARTE* MOTION
TO EXTEND THE TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER, CONTINUE THE ORDER
TO SHOW CAUSE HEARING, AND MODIFY SCHEDULE**

On this day the Court considered Plaintiff's *Ex Parte* Motion to Extend the Temporary Restraining Order, Continue the Order to Show Cause Hearing, and Modify Schedule. Having reviewed the Motion with supporting legal authority, and the Declaration of Brian Samuel Malkin, the same having established that good cause exists for granting Plaintiff's Application. This includes the necessity to preserve the Court's equitable protection over sequestered assets, the reality that it appears that all or nearly all Defendants are likely foreign nationals in need of domestic counsel, and the complexity of attaining timely and proper notices to and service upon such Defendants. Plaintiff's Application is hereby **GRANTED** as follows (the "Order"):

ORDER

A. Defendants are hereby ORDERED to show cause before this Court in the United States District Court for the Western District of Pennsylvania, the U.S. Courthouse, 700 Grant Street, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania in Courtroom No. 6A on the 6th day of April at 10:30 a.m. EDT or at such other time that this Court deems appropriate, why a preliminary injunction, pursuant to


FRCP 65(a), should not issue. The Temporary Restraining Order shall remain in effect until further Order of this Court. Defendants are on notice that failure to appear at the hearing may result in the imposition of a preliminary injunction against them. **FURTHER, THE COURT HEREBY GIVES NOTICE THAT IT MAY SET THIS PROCEEDING TO OCCUR BY VIDEOCONFERENCE AND WOULD DO SO VIA THE POSTING OF AN ORDER TO SUCH EFFECT ON THE DOCKET OF THIS CIVIL ACTION. ALL PARTIES ARE ADMONISHED TO CLOSELY MONITOR THE DOCKET FOR SUCH NOTICE, AND THE MECHANISMS FOR PARTICIPATION.**

B. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that opposing papers, if any, shall be filed electronically with the Court and served on Plaintiff's counsel by delivering copies thereof to the office of Ference & Associates LLC at 409 Broad Street, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania 15143 before Noon, EDT, March 29, 2021. Plaintiff shall file any Reply papers on or before Noon, EDT, April 2, 2021.

C. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, as sufficient cause has been shown, service shall be made in accordance with the Alternative Service Order after the Third Party Service Providers and Financial Institutions have confirmed for Plaintiff's Counsel that court-ordered restraints have been placed on the Defendants' accounts Plaintiff shall also serve a copy of this Order upon Defendants when service by Alternative means is made.
